Pastoral care and student management is based on the principles of restorative justice and due process.

At Holy Saviour School, our work with students encompasses everything that the school community does within a caring Christian environment to meet the personal, social and spiritual needs of students, staff and their families.

It involves recognising, nurturing and enriching each individual as a total and unique person within the context of a Catholic environment.

Holy Saviour School's expectations are viewed as the shared rights and responsibilities of all members within the school community. The expectations are as follows:

- Students are treated as unique individuals
- Students are challenged to develop their own potential in a stable and supportive environment
- Students feel safe within their school environment
- Students learn without interruptions
- Staff educates their students
- All property is respected

Student management is designed and implemented to guide students in fostering the school expectations. Therefore, with the guidance of the teacher, students are encouraged to develop and agree on a set of class rules. Positive and negative consequences are agreed upon. In doing so, we believe students will take ownership to their class rules and accept responsibility for their actions. When negative consequences are issued, opportunity is provided for students to reflect on their actions so as to make a plan for better decisions in the future. In this way disciplinary action is growth promoting and based on authentic Christian love and reconciliation.
